


My wife and I were part of the Canadian delegation for this conference. Take a couple of minutes to give you an overview of the event.

Two collaboration agreements were signed


And the day ended with a wonderful banquet.





The following day we were given a selective tour of the city starting with a visit to the opening of Jilin Northeast Asia Investment and Trade Expo.

We were there in time for the opening










Our Maori colleagues suited up for the tour of the plant
