Join Enno Tamm for a lecture and discussion on his 2011 Ottawa Book Award work: *The Horse That Leaps through Clouds: A Tale of Espionage, the Silk Road and the Rise of Modern China*. He will present a slideshow about his trek in 2006 from St. Petersburg to Beijing along the Silk Road, as recounted in his book. He retraced the epic journey of the Russian secret agent Baron Gustaf Mannerheim a century before in 1906. Mannerheim's secret mission assessed reform and modernization in the late Qing Dynasty in China between 1906 and 1908.

Eric Enno Tamm is an author, journalist and activist with more than 15 years' experience in the media and non-profit sector. His first book, *Beyond the Outer Shores: The Untold Story of Ed Ricketts, the Pioneering Ecologist Who Inspired John Steinbeck and Joseph Campbell*, was a Kiriyama Prize Notable Book in 2005. Born in Tofino, B.C., Tamm holds an M.A. in European Affairs from Lund University in Sweden and an M.A. in journalism from the University of Southern California in Los Angeles.
